**Paper Title (Upper and Lower case letters and no more than 100 characters in length, 16 pt font size, Bold. Title to be centered)**

Presenting Author's Initials. Surname eg. J.R. Smith (Times New Roman/12 pt font size)

Affiliation (*Name of organisation/affiliation, Times New Roman, 12 pt font size, if more than one affiliation, superscript numbers should be used to indicate the correct affiliation. Each author should indicate institute, city, state and country. Do not include degrees or professional titles (eg. Dr, Prof, etc) Example:*

J.R. Smith<sup>1</sup>, P. Jones<sup>2</sup>, R. Brown<sup>1</sup>

Corresponding Author. *Full address, including Department, Institution, City, State and Country, should be provided plus contact details including telephone and email.*

Abstract. *An abstract of 100 to 150 words is required. This abstract should be concise and reflect the content of the paper.*

Keywords. *Include three or four major descriptors of the subject of the paper.*

**Start the main body of the paper here** – *Your paper may not be longer than 3500 words (excluding graphs, figures and abstract BUT including footnotes/references). Times New Roman font, 12-point size, right and left justified. Please attempt to keep paper to 10 pages. Please do not change line height or spacing.*

Acknowledgement. *If needed, in this section please include concise thanks to supporters, research assistants and financial contributors.*

References. *In this section works cited in the paper should be listed. The list should be by number in order of citation. Please denote the citation in the text using the number of the reference eg: Following Smith [1]. For multiple citations of the same work, please reuse the citation number.*
